SUBJECT: Receipt of Preliminary Data

The CMA Monitoring Agency (RSI) has been receiving test results approximately 30 days after test completion. This time lag has not permitted timely analysis of the data for trends. The value of this type of analysis, however, has been highlighted recently in the process of resolving the Sequence IIIE wear problems.

As RSI begins to respond to the direction of the CMA Petroleum Additives Panel to become more pro-active in the analysis of data and more timely in the release of trends-information to test sponsors as a group, it is imperative that test results be communicated to RSI as soon as the results become available and are communicated to the test sponsor.

Effective immediately, preliminary test results must be sent to RSI simultaneous with their release to a test sponsor. This communication can be by mail or by fax. Laboratories submitting by electronic fax should use the same telephone number used for reporting test results (210/545-1894).

This does not supersede the requirements to forward certain pages of the final test report to RSI per RSI Bulletins #92-003 and #92-007 on Reporting Test Results.
