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SUBJECT: CMA Engine Test Database Accuracy

The use of the CMA candidate test database to proactively identify and assist in resolving industry test severity and precision problems is an important objective of the CMA Code of Practice. This objective can only be accomplished if the CMA database is kept current and accurate.

On occasion, adjustments to test results are necessary. The changes may reflect reporting errors made by the test laboratory; retroactive, industry-wide test result adjustments; or any other legitimate data corrections. When this occurs, the test laboratories must expeditiously issue replacement pages of the respective test report to the test sponsor and the CMA Monitoring Agency.

The CMA Monitoring Agency, upon written sponsor request, issues a summary of all scheduled tests for a specific Sponsor ID and Sponsor Code(s). If a sponsoring company has received a CMA Monitoring Agency Summary of Scheduled Tests prior to any corrections to test results, it is the sponsoring company responsibility to request a new summary.
